FAQ's

- What do I do?

Life story work is an invaluable process for helping adopted children to understand their past and the reasons for their adoption. A significant part of the process is to compile a life story book, which is a permanent account of the child's journey from birth to adoption and beyond.

Children's Support Pack for bereaved children containing books for memory work, bulbs and plant pots, balloons and various craft items to help children express their loss in a creative way, for example by planting bulbs or producing a memory book.

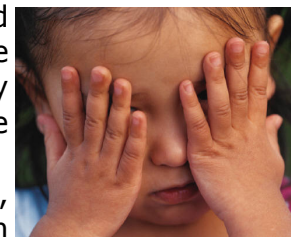
£50 could cover the cost of a support pack
